


Karl has sampled a few of the beers I have made with this setup.


Below is the first project I collaborated with Karl on. This was a custom residence on Lake Washington. Karl did the custom Metal channels and stairs.





This next project Karl again showed his expertise and attention to detail. He did all of the metal work for the stair wall and stairs and railing. Which was a blackened flame sprayed finish. He also did the enormously heavy front pivoting door. I wanted the door pull to be blended with the vertical steel slats so that when you looked at the door from a direct front view the handle would be hidden. He executed this beautifully.
